# IT SEEMED LIKE A GREAT IDEA...

The March Meet was the first weekend in March. The Hot Rod Heritage Series is a group of races put on by NHRA (the National Hot Rod Association, the fastest racing organization in the world) At Famoso Dragstrip near Bakersfield hundreds of racer and swappers annually gather for the last 50+ years to have fun in the sun (or occasional showers) for fun.



The drag racers are very serious about their racing. Richard Wilson, the owner/driver of the Voodoo Hemi I recently wrote about in the newsletter, won every round of racing. The Voodoo Hemi was the Champion of the March Meet in his 1935 DeSoto A/Gas Supercharged Hemi powered race car. It was great to see him again at the track, winning every single round! I stuck around after the Final rounds to congratulate Richard. He was very happy to see me. Not very many people who are not on a team stay at the track after the finals, since it is late, dark, and they has been there all day or weekend! Richard was happy for me to be there to congratulate him: "Thanks, that means a lot to me." Richard told me.



The racing was great, except late Saturday afternoon when it started to

rain... That means NO RACING! Drag strips have to be completely dry for the high horsepower cars to have traction. We had met new friends at the track, as we always do, and they were nice enuf to give us a ride back to our motel in Delano, which was next to ours! Usually we meet new friends from overseas, but not this year, due to travel restrictions...

The trip was great, until we had a tire go flat on the way to get some dinner after the races...

There is a HUGE pothole on Hiway 99 in Delano. I missed it twice getting on the freeway headed to the races Saturday and Sunday morning... Wife Cathy did not miss it.

So when the inconvenient dash light showed the left front tire only had 10 pounds of air pressure I quickly pulled into the gas station just before getting on the freeway to go get some dinner! It was 7pm, and we were all hungry! I valiantly tried to pump up the flat left front tire in the dark, but I heard a hissing noise. Air was coming out of the sidewall... The car was packed with all our travel gear, since we were staying Sunday nite at a different motel... So we

called AAA Road Service to help put the spare tire on... We needed to take everything out of the trunk to get at the spare, which was only used about 3 times in the 9 1/2 years since we bot the Dart... It had two issues. One was the original lug nuts had a shiny skin that loosens up when you change tires. This tends to make the lug nuts unusable, and the friendly local Chrysler dealer had some for \$10 apiece! BUT we only had a wimpy little 4-bas lug nut wrench and could NOT get those shiny expensive lug nuts loose... Such a deal... After they were replaced it was easy for the tire store where I bot the brand new Goodyear tires at the end of January easy to torque the new lug nuts down at 95 inch pounds with their air gun.

However, we only had a wimpy little 4-bas lug nut wrench and could NOT get those shiny expensive lug nuts loose... After calling AAA and having no response, wife called them again... After being bounced back and forth between Southern and Northern California AAA, we finally were told they had help on the way... Eventually, 2.5 or so hours later, the tow truck arrived and installed the spare in a few minutes. It took longer to load the car back up with the damaged almost new Goodyear tire in the truck that it took to install the spare.

We finally got some dinner at the local Delano Wings store, and finally go to the motel at 10pm!

There were wet footprints down the hall. Of course the hot tub and pool had just closed! This was a visit where they were actually working. We have been staying at the same motel, Liberty Inn since they opened years ago and had model of the Statue of Liberty in front. It is no longer there! So we finally got to sleep late that nite after two greuling days at the race track. The previous trip to Famoso Dragstrip involve staying at the Wasco Inn, which was a nightmare! They are apparently not used to customers that spend the entire night there. But that is another story...

Monday morning, after the great breakfast they serve, with unlimited bacon, we had to get a new tire. The spare tire with very low mileage was about 10 years old, and we were not going to drive home with that liability. We headed for the Delano Walmart, being careful to avoid that pothole, since they didn't answer the phone.



We got a new tire, but there was an issue! The new tires I bought in January are Goodyears... The store did not have any Goodyear tires in our

size! So we now have (Sooner or later, you'll own Generals! 1 General tire and 3 Goodyears. We made it home in 2 hours less time back to Placerville than it took to get to Delano on a Friday nite!

The next weekend I traveled to Sonoma Raceway to see my friend Adrian Smith race his 1966 Plymouth, the FASTER FARMS entry in the 24 Hours of LeMons race, which is nothing but lots of fun! The Faster Farms entry is modeled after the Foster Farms TV commercials that featured two chickens who escaped their home farm in a 1966 Plymouth, and headed for Foster Farms in California. Surely some of you remember those crazy chicken commercialst... Adrian heard about the 24 Hours of LeMons races and saw a Vagisail sticker on one of the cars and immediately decided to become a LeMons racer! He found a 1966 Plymouth





(One of his vast collection of classic Plymouths) and he and his

wife turned it into a race car. Since the LeMons cars are supposed to cost the owner less than \$500, the Plymouth qualified. The safety modifications are not part of the cost (unless you are spending the money to make the safe. Things like the Bluesmobile accessories are included in safety features to be safe on the race tracks.

At Wine Country Motorsports a helmet and driving suit may only cost \$600 or much more... But the race car has to be cheap, less than \$500. Adrian and his wife repainted the beige Plymouth blue except for the door with the Faster Farms logo on them ! It has a roll bar, special (cheap) gauges, rebuilt for racing trans and 360 cubic inches of Plymouth power under the hood ! More details will be provided as soon as they are available.

At the races at Sonoma the Plymouth had a serious (no, not seriously) wing collapse episode which briefly sidelined the Faster Farms entry until the wing could be removed, no hampering the aerodynamics of the car whatsoever. The previous wing used an ironing board (remember ironing boards?) and a bowling ball used for wing attack angle adjustments. It may return at the next race in May. It charged back onto the track with what remained of the original 145 racers... The view from the grandstands of hundreds of cars simultaneously on track is hilarious ! However, Faster Farms was later black flagged due to smoking too much (no, not tobacco or other herbs) and may have a broken ring or something like that. Too early to diagnose!

Some of the many incredibly funny things



seen at the LeMons race was a wheel broken into pieces from suspension collapse, a huge cloud of smoke when an engine expired and a lady screaming into a megaphone riding on the back of a race car that had been embarrassingly penalized for being a bad driver: She was screaming "I am sorry for being such a terrible driver !!!"
