

A Brief History of Capital City Mopars Car Club

(As told by Linn, Toni & Pete Bloathner, July 2023)

- Beginning years; 1988 1989 The purpose of club was to get parts, network with Mopar owners and make connections
- The club was for the Muscle Cars era with a focus on 1965-1972 Mopars
- Originally for Mopar owners only, later Mopar enthusiasts also joined
- First group of 10 people with 1-2 females, all the age of 25-30 years old
- Jack Podseley was first president
- Meetings were at Carmichael Elks and Rancho Cordova Elks Club
- 1990 club became official 'Capital City Mopars Car Club of California, Incorporated'
- Toni Bloathner helped name the club, a big decision was the spelling of Capital or Capitol
- Bob Berry had multiple duties including President for many years
- Mid 1990's there were more Darts and Duster members, with less muscle cars
- Getting parts from Pick n Pull other junkyards were common
- Internet later is used for connections, there was less need for member connections
- 1999 Membership was approximately 50-60 people
- Members became of working age, and had less time for cars, which brought membership totals down
- Club members now drive Modern Mopars, which are easier to drive and have AC
- It will always be MOPAR or NO CAR
